Irish History #77

Irish History #77 - Bloody Sunday (Part 2)

British intelligence agents used information gathered during interrogations of prisoners and from informers to undermine the IRA. Michael Collins saw how this damaged the war effort. In his mind, eliminating the British intelligence system was an important imperative for victory in the War of Independence.

Collins developed a file on British agents in Dublin. He received information about them from his sources inside Dublin Castle, and from various citizens who knew of British men staying in the city. He had people collect the papers agents left in wastebaskets in hotels and homes. He had his intelligence squad, the "Twelve Apostles," tail them. Sometimes his men were picked-up for questioning, then released. This allowed them to identify British undercover officers. In this way, names, addresses and descriptions were carefully collated and turned into a dossier that listed 35 people. One of the Twelve Apostles, Frank Thornton, drafted an operational plan for Collins. Collins' goal was to kill them all at once.

Collins presented the plan to Cathal Brugha, the Irish government's Minister for Defense. Brugha recommended striking 15 names because he was not convinced there was justification for including them on the kill list. The operation tempered by Brugha's recommendation was approved by the Irish Cabinet. It would be executed against the 20 individuals whose names remained on the list, and it would require about 100 IRA men to cover the city.

Sunday morning was selected to put the operation in effect, because most of the "wanted" men were expected to be at the addresses Collins had for them. As church bells rang at 9 AM on November 21st, doors to rooms burst open and the shooting began. The first shots were mistakenly fired at the Shelbourne Hotel across from St Stephen's Green. As three IRA men with pistols in hand moved up the hotel stairs, one saw a reflection of himself in a mirror. Thinking it was a person coming at him with a gun, he fired a number of shots. This alerted the target, a British agent further upstairs, who was able to safely flee the premises.

The British officers staying at a boarding house on Upper Pembroke Street were not as fortunate. There, nine members of Collins's execution squad killed two agents and wounded four. At a house on Morehampton Road, the Chief British Intelligence Officer and a civilian were shot to death; another civilian was wounded. At Lower Baggot Street, a Captain was killed in a rented flat in front of his pregnant wife. Two others were killed in a room on Upper Mount Street, and another in a boarding house on Earlsfort Terrace. Two more were killed at the Gresham Hotel. Another was shot to death at Lower Mount Street. An IRA covering force came across two Auxiliaries near Mount Street Bridge and killed them. In a second residence on Lower Baggot Street, Captain Bagally – a barrister and courts-martial officer – was shot to death.

Some of those on the list escaped death because they were not home. The head of the Cairo Gang, Lieutenant Peel, saved himself by barricading in a room. One member of the IRA's Dublin Brigade was wounded and captured. Overall that morning, 14 were executed and five were wounded. (One of the wounded did not recover and died later.) Of the 20 targeted in the operation - i.e., approved for death by the Irish government - 11 were killed. Collins was not pleased with the tally.

In hindsight, however, the operation was seen as the turning point in the war. The "audacious" operation inflicted a staggering blow. It destroyed the British intelligence system in Dublin. Prime Minister David Lloyd George, who had said "we have murder by the throat," was proven wrong. He had to re-set British policy in Ireland.

In explaining what took place that morning, Collins wrote:

"My one intention was the destruction of the undesirables who continue to make miserable the lives of ordinary citizens. I have proof enough to assure myself of the atrocities which this gang of spies and informers have committed. Perjury and torture are words too easily for them. If I had a second motive it was no more than a feeling such as I would have for a dangerous reptile. By their destruction the very air is made sweeter. That should be the future judgment in this particular event. For myself, my conscience is clear. There is no crime in detecting and destroying in war-time, the spy and the informer."

Initial reports coming into Dublin Castle caused immediate alarm. The reports said Collins had killed approximately 50 British secret service people. British officials did not hesitate to respond with retribution. The commander of British forces in Ireland, General Sir Nevil Macready, thought IRA sympathizers with knowledge about the agent assassinations might be among the crowd of GAA fans attending the football match between Dublin and Tipperary in Croke Park. He ordered security forces to stop the game, cordon the grounds, and search all men.

The match had been advertised as a fundraiser for the association that helped dependents of IRA members who had been killed or imprisoned. Officers from the IRA's Dublin Brigade discussed whether the game should be postponed in light of the morning's events. They were afraid that calling it off would cast suspicion on the GAA. No one foresaw that an atrocity was about to take place and the match went forward.

The game was in full swing when security forces arrived. They entered the field and fired rifles and submachine guns indiscriminately into the crowd. Those who were hit fell to the ground. Among the fallen were two Tipperary players; one of whom - Mick Hogan - was dead. (Hogan Stand in Croke Park was dedicated to him in 1926.) Thirteen died, some from gunfire and others from being crushed in the

mayhem. Two boys, one 10 years old and the other 11, were among the casualties of gunfire.

Panicked spectators ran for cover. Some spectators and players packed into a dressing room for safety. An Auxiliary shouted to the group while brandishing a gun: "Here we avenge our fallen comrades." Thousands caught inside the grounds were lined up, made to hold their hands over their heads, and searched. When it was over, security forces simply left the gruesome scene in lorries, one dragging an Irish Tricolor behind it.

In a matter of 90 seconds, 14 were killed and 62 were injured. The British blamed the devastating loss of life on the IRA. They falsely stated that their forces went to the field to arrest IRA gunmen in attendance and that, as they were approaching, rebel sympathizers fired shots to warn the IRA. According to the British account, those warning shots caused a stampede and confusion which led to deaths. The statement was false. Security forces came in firing. That was their intent. Yes, the first shots caused chaos among the crowd. But that did not justify shifting blame for the deaths to the IRA.

Years later, an Auxiliary officer admitted, when they heard about the morning's bloody events, the Auxiliaries were torn between sacking and burning O'Connell Street or raiding the Gaelic football match. He said they tossed for it and Croke Park lost. This makes clear they were out for revenge. They intended all along to turn the football pitch into a killing zone.

The death toll continued to mount later in the day. Two leading members of the Dublin Brigade - Dick McKee and Peadar Clancy - had been arrested the previous night. On Bloody Sunday, they were tortured, bayonetted and shot along with Conor Clune for what Collins had done during the morning. The British falsely reported the three men were killed "while trying to escape." (Chapter 76)

On Bloody Sunday, Crown forces displayed wanton brutality against innocent, unarmed civilians. Their cruel and shameful conduct more deeply cemented the Black and Tans and Auxiliaries despicable and contemptible reputation in the minds of the Irish people. (Chapter 67) Lawless acts of vengeance perpetrated by Crown forces would not win the war. Instead, they hurt the effort by building support for the IRA insurgency amongst the populace.

In addition, the day's losses showed the British that the IRA was a more daunting opponent than they had imagined. Questions arose about whether they could be defeated. The events of that day made clear that a new British strategy was needed in order for Great Britain to extricate itself from the "Irish quagmire."

One way out for London was to send the IRA peace feelers. Sensing this was about to happen, Eamon de Valera returned to Ireland after 20 months in the United States. Back in Ireland, de Valera undermined Collins's guerilla war strategy and his leadership of the IRA.
